## Mark your calendars .... Thursday, April 25, 2019. Our next field trip will be to the Smithsonian National Zoo!



All members, members in waiting and friends are welcome. We will meet in front of the Visitor Center on Olmsted Walk (near Connecticut Avenue) at 9:00 am. Jack Rosenberg will be the field trip coordinator. Jack is a primate interpreter (this is the Smithsonian's term for a docent at their living exhibits) and is very familiar with all the zoo's collection of about 300 species of animals.

Jack will lead us through a VERY INFORMAL tour of the primary areas of interest at the zoo (pandas, elephants, gorillas, orangutans, lions, tigers and more), but please feel free to explore on your own. If you have some particular animal that you want to see (or not see), let Jack know and he will direct you or escort you to (or from) there.

Did you know that there are several buildings at the zoo that were built in the '30s and are architecturally exquisite? Come see parts of the zoo that you did not know exist!!

You may use a tripod and a flash in most areas. The use of a flash is prohibited while photographing our new baby gorilla (Moke) and baby orangutan (Redd).

The zoo is accessible via the metro and parking is available. The zoo charges \$25.00 for parking unless you are a FONZ member, so carpooling is strongly suggested.

If you are interested in getting lunch as a group afterwards, let Jack know (<u>alignm1@gmail.com</u>) and he will try to set something up at the zoo or at a nearby restaurant.

### May 1 Judge: Brian Zwit

Brian is a nature and outdoor photographer based in northern Virginia who captures the elegance and majesty of unique landscapes, wildlife, and flora throughout the United States. Brian's images are in private residences and corporate offices and have been used in regional magazines and corporate publications. He teaches workshops and classes and works with many nature and environmental organizations. He speaks to camera clubs, schools, and other non-profit organizations on creativity and photographic techniques. Brian is well known for his ability to distill complex topics into their essences and explain them in simple, easy to understand terms.

### May 8 Judge: David Blecman



Internationally recognized photographer and instructor David Blecman has taught in over a dozen countries and has photographed celebrities including President George W. Bush, Celine Dion, Moody Blues, and Jimmy Buffett. Clients have included Sears, Color Me Beautiful, JC Penney, Bath & Body Works, Cornell University, and many others. He has been published hundreds of times.

David started his photographic career in 1978 and formed Positive Negatives in 1997. He currently shoots for magazines,

fashion designers, and numerous other print and commercial accounts, as well as for models, actors, and their agencies. Specialties include, but are not limited to: child and adult models, architectural, food, fashion, swimwear, location and studio work, products, and headshots. He continues to speak at modeling and photography venues, judge at pageants, teach at modeling agencies, as well as to teach and mentor photographers, models and makeup artists internationally.

His personal mentoring programs for photographers and commercial models continues to grow in popularity. Currently he is mentoring a group of over 1100 amateur photographers, and is getting them exposure and recognition by having their work displayed and sold at local venues. ## May 22 Program: Bird Photography

In this program three NBCC members will share their insights and tips for doing bird photography. Steve Silverman will provide a general overview, with a focus on the technical "how to" aspects of bird photography. His topics will include gear, camera settings, shooting techniques, and tips for making great images.

For those new to bird photography, large birds are a good place to start. Dick Pelroy will discuss his approach to

photographing large birds alone and birds in flocks. He will discuss when to photograph, some easily accessible sites, equipment, and shooting tips.

For those wanting even more of a challenge, try photographing little birds that flit around

high in trees – warblers. Bruce Cyr will present an introduction to the especially challenging task of photographing small warblers. He will discuss characteristics of warblers that are relevant to photography, gear, when and where to photograph warblers, and useful techniques. ## May 29 Program - Street Photography with Essdras Suarez



For our final program night of the season, we are fortunate to have Essdras Suarez, who will speak to us on "Street Photography." Essdras is a Pulitzer Prize winning photographer based out of Alexandria, Virginia and the chief photographer for "million eyez," an internet-based platform that brings talented writers and photographers together. He was a photojournalist for 20 years, and he's had his images in publications such as *National Geographic*, *Time Magazine*, *The New York Times*, and the *Washington Post*, to name a few.

Essdras claims not to be a specialist, but rather a generalist in his photography, but his favorite genres are street and travel photography. He loves documenting "normalcy" - making the normal look extraordinary. He has taken photographs in about 60 countries. His mantra is, "Look at the world through others' eyes, and you'll understand where they are coming from."

He was a staff photographer at the *Boston Globe* for 12 years, and while there he received national and international accolades for his coverage of events such as the Columbine shooting, the Boston Marathon bombing, the Newton massacre, the Indonesia tsunami aftermath, and the Iraq war. He's also received multiple awards for his portrait, food, product and travel photography.

## Kent Mason's Community Outreach - A Very Personal Commitment

NBCC has a community outreach committee; most of its members are involved in the Phabulous Photographer program at Potomac Community Resources. Our team is assisting severely disabled young people by teaching them photography and having an annual showcase of their work.

Another activity under the community outreach umbrella is Kent Mason's solo work for Magruder High School. He collects used equipment (*film* equipment, which is what high school students study and love!), conducts an annual class about professional photography, talks up camera clubs, and organizes an annual photo exhibit that draws hundreds of photos. Kent selects the top 20 images; those photographers are each given a small but exciting cash award (that generates many tweets), and they are invited to attend our NBCC special events at no cost.

A number of NBCC members have generously contributed used photographic equipment via Kent, and the club provides the cash for the exhibit awards.

This year there is an extra twist. Kent has recently moved from his house in Rockville to a condo in Leisure World. One of the victims of the inevitable downsizing is his large collection of photo equipment, including an impressively large light table. Magruder is the very excited recipient of his excess gear. (If you don't know what a light table is ... you got into photography after 2007.)

A special appreciation goes to Kent for his years of dedicated service to aspiring high school photographers, and his exceptional generosity this year. If you're interested in supporting and mentoring at another Montgomery County high school, Kent would be the person to chat with!

## Advanced Print Winners April (Panorama) Competition



1st Place
Mixing Vats in Concrete Central

<u>Location</u>: Abandoned silo in Buffalo, NY, in a place called "Silo City." The entire complex covers a large city block with mostly 10+ story grain silos, full of exotic machinery in various stages of rust and decay. No lighting, holes in the floors with the next step 30 feet down, but all-and-all a photographer's paradise for old abandoned things, soft colors and low light. <u>Exposure</u>: 5 stops for each image in a series of HDR images to control contrast and bring up shadows. <u>Stitching</u>: 15 HDR images using software that is part of Photoshop CC. <u>Editing</u>: The RAW filter (vertical alignments, colors, sharpening tools) and Nik Color Efex Pro for additional contrast and color control. <u>Final sharpening</u>: Output sharpening tool from the Nik Suite.



2nd Place Sidewalk Cafe © **Tammy Trocki** 

This pano was stitched from 7 horizontal shots using a 70 mm lens. The light was contrasty, so in LR, I made a slight HDR effect by opening up the shadows and lowering the highlights. This makes the faces easier to read and gives the piece a slightly painterly look. I was drawn to the groups of people, each doing their own thing, but looking similar at the uniform tables and chairs. LR pano did a great job of eliminating "ghosts" of people who moved from one shot to another. I had to "fix" one lady's hair in PS by compositing in a piece of one of the original photos.



3rd Place Luce Foundation Center © **Bruce Cyr** 

Panorama of the Luce Foundation Center on the third floor of the American Art Museum. Handheld using a Rokinon 12mm f2.8 Fisheye on a Sony A7R III. Five panels stitched in Kolor AGP. Post-processing to saturate and darken blacks and reds, tint the glass ceiling blue, lighten darks in the tungsten-lit interiors and vignette the sides. Printed on matte paper to reproduce details for maximum effect.

## Novice EIC Winner April (Panorama) Competition

In late September of 2018, I travelled to the Grand Tetons and Yellowstone National Park for the first time. Hoping to capture memorable images of the Tetons, I headed out at predawn to shoot the sunrise. That morning turned out to be cloudy. Recent wildfires had left a haze along the Snake River valley that obscured much of the Grand Tetons. Making the best of the conditions, I waited until the clouds lifted enough to show the peaks above the haze and captured this image of the barn, the fields and the mountain range.

#### **Intermediate EIC Winners**

While staying in Ragusa, Sicily, we drove to the small nearby hilltown of Modica for our evening shoot. The church at the center is the Duomo of San Giorgio in Modica. I was captivated by the grandeur of the church amidst the relatively low relief of the town's simple homes. The three-shot pano was taken about 7:30 pm to capture the blue light after sunset with a three-second exposure. The rising moon was a special treat.

On a trip to Mt. Haleakala in October, after finally getting a parking place, I looked up and saw a bunch of people along the ridge line doing their own thing while watching a magnificent sunset. At the time, I didn't think much of the image, but when I put it in Lightroom and played with the adjustments I was surprised at how the silhouettes made such a fun image.

This is a cropped single shot taken during a trip to the Palouse last August. I was happy to find three hay bales for foreground interest as well as the one lonely cloud that I patiently waited for.

### Advanced EIC Winners, April (Panorama) Competition



1st Place Milky Way © **David Terao** 

This 5-image, LR-stitched pano of the Milky Way was taken in Death Valley at 4:30am from Zabriskie Point looking east. Although it was cold and windy, there were about 20 other photographers there, all shooting the Milky Way. In mid-March, the Milky Way is relatively low to the horizon, which allowed me to get the full Milky Way with mountains in the foreground. The glow in the distance is from the lights of Las Vegas - 100 miles away. I used a Canon EOS R with a Samyang 14mm/2.4 lens on a tripod. Each exposure was 30 sec @ f/2.8 and ISO 5000.



2nd Place Scotland's Glenfinnan Memorial © **Chuck Lee** 

Glenfinnan Memorial, located in the Highlands of Scotland on the shores of Loch Shiel, was photographed from an overlooking hilltop with eight frames combined through Lightroom's Photo Merge. Each handheld image was shot at F8, 1/60 of a second, ISO 320 with an Olympus camera at 31mm, overlapping each of the eight points of view by about 1/3 to enhance a more complete final panorama image merger. The historic location on a beautiful day in a country of my ancestors cried out to be documented but could not be captured in a single frame. That is my story and I am sticking with it.

I shot this image at the Goblin Valley State Park in Utah in May 2018. I was mesmerized by this place that looks otherworldly. This amazing park is filled with rock formations that look like fantastic creatures in formation, waiting inside an ancient castle. The arrangement of the figures makes this scene an ideal subject to capture as a panorama. I took this shot about half an hour before sunset. The final image was created by blending 4 images using Lightroom. I used a good amount of dodging and burning with the brush tool, to emphasize the textures and patterns in the scene. Shot with an Olympus Micro 4/3 camera (OMD EM1 MarkII) with a 12-40 f2.8 Pro lens at 21mm (42mm in full frame equivalence).
